

News from the Foods Lab

The Foods Lab is a HOT place to be at General Byng School. The varied menu this last month has encouraged beggars at the door. The grade Nine cooks have been researching and implementing their own chicken or vegetarian recipes. Each team group choose a recipe to prepare, converted the imperial measurements to metric, organized a grocery list, prepared their entrée along with rice and a dessert, served it, ate it and then evaluated the meal.

The students explored different tastes and cooking techniques. It was another delicious project in the Foods lab. Later this month these students are to visit the Winnipeg Technical College Culinary arts program for a tour and demonstration. Who knows who will be inspired to train in this field come high school?

February marks the beginning of another section of grade seven and eight students to their course in Foods and Nutrition. Familiar smells like banned chocolate chip muffins or Death by Chocolate brownies will soon be drifting down the hallways. Please encourage your child to prepare these recipes at home. The following Quesadilla recipe was an alternative to using chicken and was enjoyed by both meat lovers and vegetarians. Try it at home.

Vegetarian Quesadilla

Ingredients:

½ diced onion
½ chopped red pepper
175 ml frozen corn
50 ml drained black beans
50 ml drained chick peas
25-50 ml chopped cilantro
25 ml lime juice
½ tsp cumin
dash salt and pepper, to taste
250 ml cheese, grated
4 tortillas

Preparation:

- 1. Chop onions, peppers, and cilantro. Grate cheese
- 2. Cook the peppers and onion in oil over medium heat in a large skillet. Add cumin, salt and pepper and lime juice and cook until they are just soft, about 5 minutes.
- 3. Add black beans, chick peas and corn. Heat for 3 minutes
- 4. Divide the filling into four. (Each team member can make their own quesadillas now)
- Place a tortilla flat on the frying pan. Place a large spoonful or a thin layer of peppers on 1/2 of the tortilla. Add a thick layer of cheese and fold the tortilla. Brown on one side then flip the tortilla.
- 6. Place on pan in oven to keep warm.
- 7. Top with salsa if desired.
