Dear General Byng Families,
You have recently received the first report card of the school year. This report represents your child's level of achievement at this time, as measured against the provincial standards. Please contact your child's teacher (s) with any questions about the report and continue to communicate with them throughout the remainder of the year.

The report card is one way that the school communicates with families regarding student learning. Other formal communication occurs through the Tri-Conferences (Student, Teacher, and Parent). Our next set of conferences is scheduled for April 14 and $15^{\text {th }}$. Registrations for the conferences will be completed on-line.
Some families had difficulty registering for the conferences in December, so a link to the registration site will be placed on the school web page.

In an effort to solicit community feedback, we sent home a survey in November. The data from this survey establishes a baseline and gives us direction for our ongoing improvement efforts. We received 141 completed surveys (43\%). Some of what we learned was that:
$66 \%$ indicated satisfaction with the communication received from the school office
$70 \%$ were satisfied with the communication received from teachers
83\% were happy their child attends General Byng School
$76 \%$ would like more information sent electronically (via email)
We are currently working on changes which we hope will generate better results; look for another survey in late spring! Thank you for your time and support in this area.

We are aware that the Lions Gate Daycare will be closing at the end of June and understand how this will negatively affect families. We are working with a number of parties in an attempt to bring a stable and effective child care centre to General Byng School. We are hopeful that we will have a positive result and will update you as soon as possible.

In January and February many of us focus on the winter comfort foods and healthier eating. The grade nine students started the year with Old Fashioned Home Made Mac ' $n$ Cheese* (A delicious yet healthier alternative to the packaged kind). These students have been invited to visit the Winnipeg Technical College Culinary Arts program for a tour and
 demonstration. Who knows who will be inspired to train in this field come high school? February marks the beginning of another section of grade seven and eight students to their course in Foods and Nutrition. Familiar smells like Banana Chocolate Chip muffins or Death by Chocolate brownies will soon be drifting down the hallways. Please encourage your child to prepare these recipes at home.

## Home Made Mac 'n Cheese*

## Cheese Sauce

25 ml butter
250 ml milk

1 clove garlic $\quad 25 \mathrm{ml}$ flour
250 ml cheese dash of salt and pepper

Melt butterand add flour, stir.
Add seasonings salt, pepper and mince garlic.
Stir till smooth and slowly add milk. Do not boil.
Add grated cheese and stir till melted. Set aside.
Pasta
300 ml whole wheat macaroni salt
Fill a large pot with water. Add enough salt so that the water is as salty as the sea. Bring to a boil.
Add pasta and cook until tender. (about 8 min )
Drain and return to pot. Mix with cheese sauce. Pour into buttered casserole
Buttered crumbs
50 ml seasoned bread crumbs 10 ml butter 15 ml parmesan cheese
Melt butter, add crumbs until coated.
Sprinkle crumbs on top of pasta and then sprinkle parmesan cheese on top.
Bake uncovered at 400 F for $8-10 \mathrm{~min}$. ENJOY!
