ATTENDANCE POLICY

STUDENT ABSENCES

Parents/Guardians are asked to phone the school before 8:15 a.m. to report a student who will be absent for the morning or the full day and before 12:15 p.m. to report an afternoon absence. A note is required only when the office has not been informed by phone or when a student will be leaving early for an appointment. The note must be signed by a parent/guardian and brought to the office before morning/afternoon attendance.

LATE ARRIVALS

All students are expected to be on time and to be ready for the start of class. Students who are late either at 8:45 a.m. or 12:40 p.m. are to report to the office upon arrival.

ILLNESS

If your child becomes ill at school, you will be phoned. Your child will not be able to leave the school until we have contacted you; therefore it is very important that we have your current home and work phone numbers, as well as the numbers for an emergency back-up friend or relative. We cannot administer any medication unless we have a completed Medication or Treatment Request form signed by a Physician.

MESSAGES

Messages of an urgent or emergency nature will be delivered to students, however, <u>classes will</u> not be interrupted for social arrangements or reminders.

EARLY DEVELOPMENT INSTRUMENT

Our provincial government requires all school divisions in Manitoba participate in the administration of the Early Development Instrument (EDI) in order to have comparable data on the readiness for school of all children in Manitoba at the start of the school years. In January and February of 2009, kindergarten teachers across Manitoba will complete surveys about the readiness for school of our children in five areas: physical health and well-being, social competence, emotional maturity, language and cognitive development, language skills and general knowledge. The EDI is a population-based measure and results are provided by class and by community.

The results will be used by our school division, and our local parent-child coalitions as a resource when planning for the best programs to support the unique strengths and needs of our local communities. 



Reebok-CCM recalls hockey helmets for safety hazard

Reebok-CCM is withdrawing hockey helmets sold in Canada and the U.S. because the chinstraps can unexpectedly unfasten, meaning the helmet can come off and creating a risk of neck and head injury to users.

The Consumer Product Safety Commission said Tuesday the recall affects RBK and CCM helmets with an HECC sticker and a date code of JUN-2013.

The helmets, which were made in Canada, were sold through stores and online retailers from May 2008 through July 2008. Consumers should stop using the helmets and return them to the retailer for a replacement
