 kitchen, participated in a demonstration by the chef and took a brief look around at the other trade areas. These young cooks were inspired by Chef Rajotte.

The new grade eight section of Industrial Arts baked buttermilk scones and whipped strawberry butter which tantalized the students in the hallway. The new grade seven students began with simple but scrumptious Cheese Dreams. They have progressed to baking Banana Chocolate Chip Muffins. Next is Tacos and Lime Bavarian. Yummy!

The March recipe: This chili is yummy and lighter than traditional meat versions.

VEGETARIAN CHILI

15 ml cooking oil $\frac{1}{4}$ green pepper
1 clove garlic, minced
1 can red kidney beans ( 498 ml )
1 can chili peppers ( 125 ml )
7 ml chili powder
2 ml salt
5 ml dried oregano
2 ml all spice
1 bay leaf
125 ml shredded cheese
Instructions:

1. In a large frying pan heat oil. Add celery, green pepper, onion and garlic. Cook till tender but not brown.
2. Transfer into pot and then stir in "undrained" can of tomatoes, drained beans, peas, green chili peppers, vinegar, chili power, hot pepper sauce, salt, spices. Bring to a boil; reduce heat and simmer for 30 min .
3. Stir in tomato sauce and bring to a boil. Remove bay leaf.
4. Serve with shredded cheese.
