ENTRANCE PROCEDURES

K- 4 students enter the school through the parking lot door. (Parents please note that from 8:20-8:50 am and from 3:20-3:50 the back lane is <u>ONE WAY</u> (east-west), entering from Daniel St. and exiting out, onto Beaumont St,)

Grades 5 – 9 students enter through the front doors.

Please note that all doors, except the front door, are locked throughout the day.

STUDENT ABSENCES

Parent(s)/guardian(s) are asked to phone the school before <u>8:30 A.M.</u> to report a student who will be absent for the morning or the full day and before <u>12:30 P.M.</u> to report an afternoon absence. Please notify the school office if a child is attending an appointment. Messages can be left regarding attendance 24 hours a day. Please include the reason for the absence and the time your child will be picked up in the message or note.

All students will be called from their class by the office staff for appointments. All Grade 5-9 students are responsible to sign themselves out. They are expected to report to the office to sign in upon their return. Parent (s)/guardian(s) of K-4 students who are picking up their child for an appointment must report to the school office and sign their child out of the building.

STUDENT LATES

It is important for students to be in on time. A late arrival disrupts classes and students miss important information. Students arriving after 8:50 am in the morning and 12:40 pm in the afternoon must report to the office for a late slip to gain entrance to the class. Please check the daily routine schedule to ensure your child comes to school on time .

CALL BACK SYSTEM

Parent(s)/guardian(s) will be contacted if their child is unaccounted for (child is absence without reason/notification).

VISITORS TO THE SCHOOL

All parents/guardians/visitors need to report to the school office. Students will be called to the office if they are being picked up and parents/guardians must sign them out. If you are volunteering in the school, you will need to sign in at the office and obtain an identification pass.

MESSAGES

Messages of an urgent or emergency nature will be delivered to students, however, <u>classes will not be</u> interrupted for social arrangements or reminders.

Grade 7 Science - May and June

Grade 7's have begun a Year End Project that is due Tuesday, May 24. They have been given thirteen topics to choose from within the four Grade 7 units. Topics relate to the science inquiry, design or research processes. It is an individual project and students are to supply their own materials. They have four computer periods at school but some of the work will have to be completed outside of class. Students will present their projects late May and early June prior to preparations for the exam. It has the same mark value as each of the units covered this year so it is an opportunity to raise their year end mark significantly. For more information, please refer to the student handouts or the school wiki.

Grade 7's also have a field trip to Fort Whyte on Thursday, May 5. Permission forms were sent home last Tuesday, April 26 and must be returned by Tuesday, May 3. Students must dress appropriate for the weather (as they will be outside all day) and bring a litter free bag lunch. Students will return to General Byng for period 6. The permission form is also available on the school wiki.

The Grade 7 Ecosystem Unit Test is scheduled for Friday, May 20. This is the last test before the final exams in June.

Food for Thought

News from the Foods Lab

May brings the warm weather and greening of the Earth outside. It is a great time to eat fresh new vegetables. Asparagus is plentiful right now as are fresh herbs. Salads taste better with fresh dill, mint or cilantro. Who doesn't enjoy new potatoes with butter and fresh dill and chives?

May is also the month that the division hosts a Junior Iron Chef culinary competition at Winnipeg Technical Center. The GB Iron chef semi finals took place the last week of April with sixteen grade nine Food and Nutrition students compete for a place on the select team. Guest Chefs, Shannon Stebelko and Natalia Anderson judged the competition. Because of the caliber of the cooks at our school it took many hours of deliberation, but they finally settled on four students. Our team this year consists of four students Tia Friesen, Drew Weibe, Laura Friesen and Kaylee Comber

Congratulations to all who competed, you made me very proud.

We also have begun with the last rotation of grade sevens and eights who begin their session in the foods lab. These beginning cooks are very inspired by the Grade nine cooks and are keen to produce yummy and healthy snacks. Please encourage your children to practice cooking in their own kitchen and share some of the recipes we prepare at school.

Grilled Asparagus Salad

- 60 ml olive oil
- 30 ml lemon juice
- 12 fresh asparagus spears
- 180 g fresh spinach leaves
- 10 g grated Parmesan cheese
- 7 g seasoned slivered almonds

Directions

Preheat a grill for low heat. Combine the lemon juice and olive oil on a plate. Place asparagus on the plate, and roll around to coat.

Grill asparagus for about 5 minutes, turning at least once, and brushing with the olive oil mixture. Remove from the grill, and place back onto the plate with the oil.

.In a large bowl, combine the spinach, Parmesan cheese, and slivered almonds. Cut asparagus into bite size pieces, and add to the salad along with the lemon juice and oil from the plate. Toss to blend, then serve.

PRESS RELEASE

April 26, 2011

The Provincial Government recently announced that for 2011, the Education Property Tax Credit has increased from \$650 to \$700. The 2011/12 Pembina Trails School Division Budget approved on March 10, 2011, had generated a tax reduction to the Typical Homeowner with a home assessed at the market value \$290,000. The tax reduction in that Budget was \$2 or .1%. The increase in the Property Tax Credit revises the Pembina Trails School Division tax reduction to \$52 or 4.3%. The Education Property Tax Credit is part of the Province's education funding to school divisions which is credited directly against property tax.

WELCOME TO KINDERGARTEN

Children that are registered for September 2011 Kindergarten will be receiving an invitation shortly to the **Welcome to Kindergarten night**. This is an exciting evening where children and parents participate in learning activities to help prepare the kids for school. Kids and parents will also get a chance to meet some of their future classmates and their families along with some of the other adults at our school. 


