## FOOD FOR THOUGHT

News from the Foods Lab

May brings the warm weather and greening of the Earth outside. It is a great time to eat fresh new vegetables. Asparagus is plentiful right now as are fresh herbs. Salads taste better with fresh dill, mint or cilantro. Who doesn't enjoy new potatoes with butter and fresh dill and chives?


May is also the month that the division hosts a Junior Iron Chef culinary competition at Winnipeg Technical Center. The GB Iron chef semi finals took place the last week of April with sixteen grade nine Food and Nutrition students competing for a place on the select team. Guest Chefs, Shannon Stebelko and Natalia Anderson judged the competition. Because of the caliber of the cooks at our school it took many hours of deliberation, but they finally settled on four students. Our team this year consists of four students; Rahne Templeton, Reagan Balcaen, Lomalanga Mkhabela, and the alternate Zachary Friesen. Congratulations to all who competed, you made me very proud.

We also have begun with the last rotation of grade sevens and eights who begin their session in the foods lab. These beginning cooks are very inspired by the Grade nine cooks and are keen to produce yummy and healthy snacks. Please encourage your children to practice cooking in their own kitchen and share some of the recipes we prepare at school.

## Grilled Asparagus Salad

- 60 ml olive oil
- 30 ml lemon juice
- 12 fresh asparagus spears
- 180 g fresh spinach leaves
- 10 g grated Parmesan cheese
- 7 g seasoned slivered almonds

Directions

1. Preheat a grill for low heat. Combine the lemon juice and olive oil on a plate. Place asparagus on the plate, and roll around to coat.
2. Grill asparagus for about 5 minutes, turning at least once, and brushing with the olive oil mixture. Remove from the grill, and place back onto the plate with the oil.
3. In a large bowl, combine the spinach, Parmesan cheese, and slivered almonds. Cut asparagus into bite size pieces, and add to the salad along with the lemon juice and oil from the plate. Toss to blend, then serve.

## GUIDANCE

Students in kindergarten, grade one \& two received classes on the conflict resolution program called "Kelso". The program discusses the difference between problems which the students can try to resolve on their own, and those that they need to get assistance from an adult. The strategies the students were taught included how to calm themselves when they are angry, how to speak assertively when upset with a friend, as well as various other strategies.
